Subject: Application for using a drone at Geysir geothermal area

The Environment Agency of Iceland has received an application from Boutique Iceland, dated 1st of October 2018, for a permit to film with a drone within the Geysir geothermal area.

Geysir is listed on the Nature Conservation Register and is under the Environment Agency supervision.

Description of the project:

The project applied for is to photograph, using a drone, near Strokkur within the Geysir geothermal area on the 24th of October 2018. The project will last for about 30 minutes using one drone and cameras. The drone will be used for about 10 minutes at an altitude of about 6 meters. 14 employees will be on location. No props, sets nor chemicals will be used and there is no need to go off paths.

Impact assessment:

Regarding flying a drone in the area: Based on the information from the applicant the Environmental Agency of Iceland considers the project not likely to have a negative impact on the conservation value of the area. However, due to the high number of visitors, flying a drone might impact visitors experience in a negative way.

Conclusions and conditions:

The Environment Agency of Iceland hereby grants a permission on its behalf on following conditions:

- Keep this letter with you on site during the project.
- If the dates of the project change the Environment Agency shall be notified, with at least 5 days notice, if possible, when the project starts. Otherwise as soon as possible.
- The Environment Agency should be informed if there will be any changes to the project description.
- The Environment Agency requests that the ranger will be contacted at least 24 hours before starting the project and inform him on your intentions.
- Crew members should always stay on authorized paths.
- For security reasons flying the drone above Strokkur is prohibited.
- Fauna, geological formations and landscape should not be disturbed in any way.

- The crew should be conscious of other guests on the sites and make sure that filming causes as little disturbance as possible to other visitors. During early morning and late afternoon, there are less people visiting the sites.
- The project's staff is required to prevent all disturbance to the environment and make sure that all litter is removed from the sites.
- The permit conditions should be introduced to the staff before the work begins.
- The conductor of the unmanned aircraft shall wear high visibility clothing so that he can be identified as the conductor of the unmanned aircraft.
- An unmanned aircraft should never be flown near people. Please take precaution not to disturb people's experience, their safety or personal privacy nor the general peace of the protected areas filmed.
- According to Icelandic law it is forbidden to fly close to cliffs where birds nest. An unmanned aircraft should never be flown near animals or birds, neither in nesting areas nor during nesting season or any other seasonal time when animals or bird habitats are considered vulnerable.
- The conductor of the unmanned aircraft is responsible for the aircraft within the protected area. This includes responsibility so that people, fauna and nature is unharmed because of the aircraft's use and that no permanent mark be left on the site in question. Should the aircraft crash, all components from it must be collected and removed from the area.
- The usage of a drone shall be according to regulation no. 990/2017 on the operation of remotely piloted aircraft (<https://www.icetra.is/aviation/drones/>).


Permission fee:

Environment Agency of Iceland charges a fee for processing applications for permits in protected areas based on Article 92 of Act no. 61/2013 on Nature Conservation. The fee for cinematography and/or photography is 52.600 ISK according to art. 24. b. in the agency's tariff no. 535/2015.

Supervision:

The Environment Agency will supervise the project. The supervisor will be a ranger from the Environment Agency.
